COMMUNITY UPDATE

What activities are your Labour representatives involved in on your behalf?

THE SIDINGS, KIMBERLEY

Richard organised a meeting which took place in early November, bringing together residents, police, representatives of the Town Council, County Council and Broxtowe Borough Council to try and work out how the anti social behaviour that regularly takes place could be properly tackled and curtailed.

We understand that there is now extra CCTV provision in the area, additional street cleansing, additional street lighting and a firm commitment from the Police to regularly patrol this area, especially on Thursday evenings at and weekends.

In addition Richard met with Paul Crompton (Broxtowe Borough Council CCTV manager), & Richard Sample (Notts County Council Youth Service Outreach Work) & residents last Wednesday 16 November to talk about the possibility of diverting the young people that congregate near The Sidings to the Hall om Wong park. Richard Sample's team would then do some interactive work with the youngsters. Keep in touch with Richard for more information.

EASTWOOD ROAD, KIMBERLEY

Trevor & Richard have been informed by the County Council that the introduction of 30mph flashing signs to slow down traffic are being considered for Eastwood Road. The earliest they could be installed is from April 2006 onwards. Keep in touch with Trevor for more information.
